TIPS TO GET A GOVERNMENT TENDER

1. You need to always go through the bid documents carefully.
2. Always make sure your documents are completed in full.
3. A proper cost analysis needs to be done when calculating your bid prices. A bid calculated either too high or low will be considered unresponsive.
4. You need to inquire about the bid and get all the relevant information before completing the tender document.
5. If you were unsuccessful in the bidding process, feel free to ask about why you failed. With that information, you will learn from the mistakes made.
6. Meet all requirements within the specified time, in the event your bid is successful, honour it.
7. Do not offer any false information or misinterpretations in your bid documentation, and it is highly illegal and enforceable by law.
8. Make sure you deliver on quality services and products as this will improve your track record and right standing with the department and by extension, give a proper face to small businesses in general.



Are you a supplier and intend to do business with the government? Good news is, you do not have to physically go to government offices and be in long queues for hours to transact business.

More so, you do not need "connections" to get a government tender, as long as you have the required qualifications, you can go for IFMIS self-registration.

In order to position your entity to get tenders it is important to play by these rules:

Rule 1: Make sure your business is registered, either as a sole proprietorship, partnership, limited company or a cooperative.

Rule 2: Obtain a PIN and tax compliance exemption certificate for the business from the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA). For more information about this you can visit the KRA website.

Rule 3: It is important to obtain requisite certifications from professional bodies and authorities. For instance, if you're physically disabled, you may need to obtain requisite certification from the National Council for Persons with Disability.

THE INCOME TAX ACT (CAP. 470) REQUEST FOR FEEDBACK ON THE DRAFT INCOME TAX (REAL ESTATE INVESTMENT TRUSTS) RULES, 2020

The Capital Markets Authority is mandated under the Capital Markets Act to develop all aspects of the capital markets with particular emphasis on the removal of impediments to and the creation of incentives for, longer term investments in productive enterprises.

Tax is one of the key factors that has a major impact on the competitiveness of products and over the years, the Authority has proposed, and the National Treasury has implemented various tax neutrality measures aimed at promoting effective roll out of new capital markets products and services. One of the tax neutrality measures implemented in the recent past relates to the introduction of Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs).

Section 20 of the Income Tax provides that a real estate investment trust (REIT) alongside unit trusts and collective investment schemes, is exempt from income tax. The Finance Act, 2019 further exempted investment companies wholly owned by a REIT from income tax. In this regard, the Authority has developed draft Regulations to operationalize Section 20 (c) and (d) of the Income Tax Act on exemption of REITs.

The Authority wishes to invite the general public and stakeholders to submit comments on the said Regulations which can be accessed on the Capital Markets Authority website: www.cma.or.ke.

REQUEST FOR COMMENTS ON THE DRAFT KENYA DEVELOPMENT BANK BILL, 2020

The Cabinet in line with the recommendation by the 2013 Presidential Taskforce on Parastatal Reforms approved the merger of Industrial and Commercial Development Corporation (ICDC), IDB Capital Limited and Tourism Finance Corporation (TFC) to form the Kenya Development Bank (KDB) as a single cross-sector Development Finance Institution (DFI) with sufficient scale, scope and resources to play a catalytic role in Kenya's Economic Development by providing long-term financing and financial, investment and business advisory services to meet objectives under vision 2030 and to support implementation of the Big 4 Projects.

The merger of the three DFIs has been identified as one of the critical reforms required to support the Manufacturing deliverable under the Big 4 Agenda, and may be critical post Covid-19 to provide assistance to industries.

A taskforce comprising of senior officers from the National Treasury & Planning, Ministries of Tourism & Wildlife; and Industry, Trade & Enterprise Development, the Attorney General and the three DFIs developed a draft Kenya Development Bank Bill, 2020 to facilitate the merger.

The purpose of this press release is to invite comments on the draft Kenya Development Bank Bill, 2020 in line with the Constitution requirement to seek views of the stakeholders and public. However, in view of the public health threat of COVID-19, and the Presidential Directive on this matter made on 17th March 2020, no public hearing/oral submissions will be held.

The Communications Authority of Kenya (CA) is the regulatory agency for the local ICT industry with responsibilities in telecommunications, e-commerce, broadcasting, cyber-security and postal/courier services. The Authority is also responsible for managing the country's numbering and frequency spectrum resources, administering the Universal Service Fund (USF) as well as safeguarding the interests of ICT consumers.

The advent of digital broadcasting has changed the broadcasting value chain by introducing key intermediary players between content production and consumers. As a result, an increasingly large number of consumers in Kenya access premium multi-channel broadcast content delivered through satellite, terrestrial, internet and cable networks.

Under the current broadcasting value chain, broadcasters and consumers alike are increasingly expecting the players in the value chain to provide services and networks that meet a given level of performance commensurate with the needs of the broadcasting service consumers.

Accordingly, and in line with Kenya Information and Communications Act, 1998 (as amended) on protection of consumers and promotion of quality of service in the regulated sectors, the Authority has developed a framework for assessment of quality of service (QoS) for broadcasting services and systems.

NOTE

- A person shall not be qualified for appointment as a Registrar or Assistant Registrar if the person has, at any time within the preceding five years, held office or stood for election as a Member of Parliament or a county assembly or as a member of a governing body of a political party;
- The Registrar and Assistant Registrars shall serve for a non-renewable term of six (6) years and shall not be eligible for re-appointment;
- The office of the Registrar shall be a State Office within the meaning of Article 260 of the Constitution.
